PERTH ARCHDIOCESAN ASSEMBLY

The Archdiocese of Perth has completed its discernment and dialogue about the establishment, structure and purpose of a Diocesan Pastoral Council (DPC) as an advisory body to the Archbishop of Perth. This was a recommendation of the recent Plenary Council in Australia. In simple terms a DPC is the equivalent of a Parish Pastoral Council. IMPORTANT UPDATE: SCREENING REQUIREMENTS FOR OUR CHURCH WORKERS : Ensure all Church workers – unpaid - meet these new screening requirements by **1 August 2024**.

The poster details the 'Safeguarding Level 1 - Induction e-Learning' process. It includes three steps: 1. Go to the Safeguarding website (https://safeguarding.perthcatholic.org.au/training) and watch the presentation video. 2. Register your details and complete the quiz. 3. Your completion will be recorded and your Parish/Agency/Organisation will be notified. It also shows a 'Certificate of Completion' and a keyboard graphic with 'QUIZ' highlighted.

- All volunteers** are required
 - to sign a **Safeguarding Personal Declaration form and safeguarding induction Training .**
 - parents who children** are under the age of 18 years will need to fill out a Consent form, if you want your children to continue as volunteers.
 - Safeguarding Induction Training Level 1 can be done either online (instruction on left picture) or in-person. You will need to register online [Safeguarding Training and Registration – Safeguarding Office \(perthcatholic.org.au\)](https://safeguarding.perthcatholic.org.au/training).

All volunteers who have keys to the Church or Hall needs to have a VPC and All Volunteers who interact with children will need a WWCC. Parish will reimburse you.

Parish Centre Construction Update

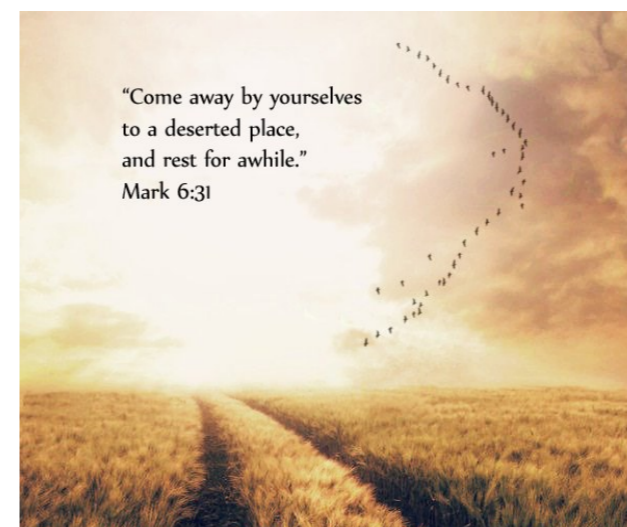
CAUTION CONSTRUCTION IN PROGRESS The painting of the ceilings and doors has been completed and the front doors installed.
