#### First Reading Acts 10: 34, 37-43

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'


### Gospel John 20:1-9

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. #### Reflection on Easter: (Pastoral liturgy)

At the heart of the account of the Resurrection in Luke's Gospel are a question, a proclamation, and a call to remember, all addressed to women. Women who were, when we stop to think about it, simply doing what women of the time were expected to do: bringing spices to the tomb to care for the dead. But life changes forever: 'Why look among the dead for some who is alive? He is not here, he has risen...Remember what he told you when he was still in Galilee.' Many of the characters in the passion stories of the past week had gone back - or soon would - to their 'pre-Jesus' lives. We can imagine the religious authorities, Pilate, and the crowds all going back to 'normal', having dealt with the interloper from Galilee. In a sense, they were dead looking for life among the dead. But we dare not forget for we too can be like the dead looking for life among the dead. It can happen to us, too, unless we open ourselves to meeting the good news of Jesus. The good news of Jesus meets us, challenges us - unexpectedly - in the midst of the ordinariness of our lives. The Resurrection challenges us to take stock of what we are doing and where we are looking and challenges us to always 'remember what he told us.' Oddly, yet with beautiful simplicity. Luke's account of the Resurrection ends not with an appearance of the Risen Jesus, but with the empty tomb; with the disbelief of some in the community; with the amazement of others. Once more, we are called to be amazed. Once more, on this Easter Day, we are called to wash ourselves again with the saving waters of Baptism, in order that we might not just remember what he told us, but indeed share in his resurrection. In this water, we find the One who is alive. Today, the darkness of sin is washed away forever through water. Today, we are called to always remember what he told us.




